October 20, 2018

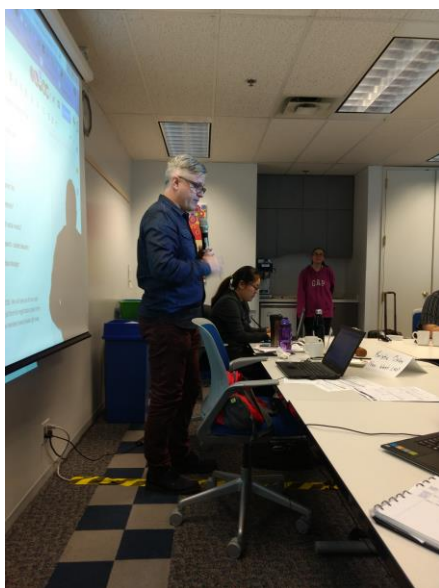
The day after our successful conference, chapter councilors from across the province met for our fall chapter councilors' meeting.
